PreK-5

1. To register a device for student use, go to the website listed above and enter the teacher's email. This is `firstname.lastname@lmsvsd.net`. For example, if the teacher's name is Cathy Brown, her email would be cathy.brown@lmsvsd.net.
2. You will then get to a screen for the student to login. The students should use the same login credentials that they use with all of our learning resources.
3. If the student has never used Lexia, he/she will take a placement test, and then the program will place him/her in the most appropriate level.
