

## **Academy Enrollment Process**

## Open enrollment begins Thursday, October 3, 2019 and concludes on Tuesday, December 3, 2019 at noon.

Complete all parts of the packet. <u>Incomplete packets will not be processed</u> .	
Incorrect information will impact enrollment.	
Two proofs of residency. Acceptable examples: utility bill, driver license w/ current address, escrow papers, rental agreement, property tax bill. Only required for grades 7 and 8.	
Students not currently enrolled in a La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools will need to complete district registration forms upon acceptance into the program.	
An interdistrict transfer will be required <b>upon acceptance</b> of students who do not live within the boundaries of La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools.	
Students who currently attend other LMSVS schools on an interdistrict transfer will need to resubmit their transfers.	
Students with a 504 Plan must provide a copy of their plan with this enrollment packet.	
Students with an IEP must provide a copy of their plan with this enrollment packet. We take pride in the quality programs and services we provide throughout LMSVS. It is our responsibility to ensure quality and equity of services for students throughout the district and not compromise the quality of our programs or our commitment to excellence. Should services not be available at the Academy of desired enrollment, services can be provided at another school within our district.	
The district's Special Education Department will review the IEP to verify availability of services prior to final approval of a student's enrollment at an Academy. <u>Enrollment of all students on an IEP is pending approval by the La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools Special Education Department.</u>

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## The dress code applies to all students at LMAAC.

The La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools School District is proud of its students and their accomplishments. Student appearance and dress should be a reflection of a serious learning environment. Appropriate dress and good grooming contribute to a positive atmosphere and promote student safety.

In accordance with California Education Code, Section 48907, and with the best interest of our students, school and school-sponsored activities, and community in mind, the following District dress code has been adopted. We appreciate your support and adherence to these guidelines.

	Attire for our students should be modest and age-appropriate.
	Clothing must be worn as designed, not modified. It should be clean and in good
	repair. Pants with shreds, tears or holes may be worn ONLY with leggings
	underneath.
	Loose fitting garments that show underclothing or expose private parts of the body
	are prohibited.
	Backless, strapless, spaghetti straps, low-cut neckline, tank tops, see-through, and
	bare-midriff tops are considered inappropriate for school and are not permitted.
	Shirts must have sleeves.
	Shorts, dresses, and skirts must be mid-thigh in length, even over leggings.
	Leggings must be worn with a loose-fitting shirt that covers the bottom
	around to the front. If your child wears shorts over leggings, the shorts must be
	mid-thigh in length.
	Pants are to be worn at waist level. Belts are to be worn through the loops.
	Closed-toed shoes, sneakers, or other appropriate footwear must be worn at all
	times. No flip-flops or slippers—all shoes must be close-toed and have back straps.
	Heel height of shoes must be safe and appropriate for school.
	Clothing and/or jewelry with inappropriate language, pictures, inferences, or symbols
	judged by an administrator to be obscene or inappropriate; intended to mock,
	ridicule, provoke, demean; or displaying words or pictures associated with alcoholic
	beverages, weapons, tobacco products, or other drugs, or items associated with
