

LMAAC 2020-2021 Specialty Courses Grades 7 and 8

At LMAAC, we offer a variety of specialty courses. Our general policy is that students make a commitment to year-long classes. Support or Study Skills courses may replace a specialty course if a student requires more academic support. Students receive two specialty courses.

Students will be given the opportunity to choose one specialty course. The second placement may be scheduled by school personnel ensuring all students experience a variety of art forms.

3-D Art: This advanced course is for students who are interested in creating 3 Dimensional projects with various materials. Application is required.

Art: Introduces basic art concepts and skills in a fun and non-threatening environment. Each grade level explores different concepts and projects. This class promotes self-confidence, creativity, and an appreciation of fine arts.

ASB: Students must complete an application to be considered for acceptance into this class. Two teacher recommendations are required. Students in ASB develop leadership skills through in-class activities and in the planning and presenting of school-wide activities and events.

Community Action Team: "C.A.T." coordinates service projects on campus and in our community. Students may also participate in cross-age tutoring with younger students. Application is required.

Concert Band: Concert Band is a performing group featuring musical styles including classical, jazz, rock, pop, and movie soundtracks. Instrumentation includes brass, woodwind, and percussion. No experience necessary.

Culinary Arts: Students learn basic cooking techniques, sanitation and safety measures, how to use kitchen tools and equipment, nutritional information, crop cultivation, the principles of teamwork, and other food-related topics. Students participate in observations, hands-on activities, and traditional academic assignments including research, projects, presentations, and assessments.

Dance Audition Group: Students must attend **both** audition days. Students are placed in an appropriate class as determined by teacher.

Dance: Grade 7 and 8 non-audition course teaching hip-hop, jazz, and basic ballet foundations.

Digital Keys/Recording: This class is a hybrid of traditional piano technique and digital recording. Students of all skill levels will learn the fundamentals of music theory and how to combine these methods with recording software.

Film Studies: This class is designed to show students how film is a form of literature and, by viewing classic and modern American films, students will learn that good film, like good literature, has certain elements in common. Additionally, students will be reading classic literature.

Future Teachers: In this class, students will assist other students in reaching their full potential by utilizing 1:1 tutoring, small group support, supervision of projects, and peer mentoring.

Guitar: Includes beginners to advanced grade 7 and 8 students. Students use school guitars in classroom.

Jazz Band: "Big Band" style audition class covering sounds of 50's–70's, modern pop, rock, Latin, and soundtracks. Instrumentation includes brass, woodwind, and percussion.

Masters Art: Students must apply to be part of the Masters Art class. The art teacher will select students for this more specialized art class. Students will be involved in coordinating and operating the Fireside Art Gallery three times per year.

Media: This class produces the Wildcat News Broadcast that involves filming, writing, editing, and anchoring our twice a week broadcast. Special feature stories are also part of this class. Applications are required.

Orchestra: Stringed instruments including violin, viola, cello, and upright bass (no guitar).

Performance Keyboards: Audition is required for students with experienced piano skills. Performances may occur both on and off campus.

Rock U: Explore vocal and instrumental music through a modern rock band setting. We will introduce guitar, electric guitar, bass, keys, percussion, vocals, and songwriting. Performances may occur both on and off campus. This class is designed to Teach U, Empower U, and Rock U!!

Symphonic Band: This is an advanced performance class featuring musical styles such as classical, jazz, pop, rock, soundtracks. Instrumentation includes brass, woodwind, and percussion. Experience is necessary.

Tap: Grades 7 and 8 non-audition course teaching beginning elements of tap, rhythm, and sound.

Technology: This class will introduce computer skills such as PowerPoint, I-Movie, keyboarding, and more.

Theatre: LMAAC theatre classes are developed utilizing the National Theatre Arts Standards. Theatre I and Theatre II are performance based classes requiring an audition.

Vocal Audition Group: Coursework covers the fundamental skills of singing and performing in a choir including technique, theory, music reading, and history. Audition required. Performances on and off campus.

Vocal: This class is a non-auditioned vocal group covering the fundamental skills of singing and performing in a choir including technique, theory, and history. Performances on campus with opportunities for off campus performances.

Yearbook: Yearbook requires after hours commitments, perseverance, and students who are highly motivated and responsible. Students must submit an application and teacher evaluation to be considered for acceptance into this class.
