Q.	I am unable to find the information I need, who do I contact?

Q.	When does school start?
A.	<p>The 2020-2021 School Year officially begins on August 10th. Please note, due updated County & State Guidelines, we will begin the year with full distance learning (Level 1) GROSSMONT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT REOPENING PLAN (coming soon)</p> <p>Teachers will be reaching out to students using email, Infinite Campus, Schoology and phone calls.</p>
Q.	What is Distance Learning? How often will I be in a live class meeting. Are there specific times I will be required to be online?
A.	<p>General Weekly Overview:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Monday: Teachers share weekly goals and schedule Monday - Friday: Students work on activities, teachers provide feedback, messaging, chatting, etc. Tuesday / Thursday: Live Class Schedule <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Period 1: 10:00am - 11:00am Period 3: 11:30am - 12:30pm Wednesday / Friday: Live Class Schedule <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Period 5: 10:00am - 11:00am Period 7: 11:30am - 12:30pm Teacher and student contact is expected each day through one or more of the following activities: class updates, delivery/collection of assignments, feedback on assignments, live whole class or small group meetings (Zoom or Google Meet), messaging with Google Chat, email, Campus Messenger, Remind or Schoology

Q.	Will attendance be taken?
A.	Teachers will track attendance through participation in live sessions and the completion of weekly assignments. Infinite Campus will be used to track participation on a weekly basis

Q.	Will grades be given?
A.	Students will be accountable for grades. Grading practices will be clearly articulated in the syllabus for each course and as needed throughout the course. Questions about grading policies should be directed to each teacher.

Each term is only 9 weeks long. This means you will be issued final grades every 9 weeks and these grades will be reported on your official transcript. Here is a breakdown: Quarter 1 (Periods 1, 3, 5, 7) - August 10, 2020 to October 9, 2020 Quarter 2 (Periods 2, 4, 6) - October 12, 2020 to December 18, 2020 Quarter 3 (Periods 1, 3, 5, 7) - January 11, 2021 to March 12, 2021 Quarter 4 (Periods 2, 4, 6) - March 29, 2021 to June 7, 2021</p> <p>New Calendar for 2020-21 (Please note the changes in Winter Break and Spring Break)</p>
