45-Day Budget Revision

Pursuant to Education Code Section 42127(i)(4), not later than 45 days after the Governor signs the annual Budget Act, a school district is required to make available for public review any revisions in revenues and expenditures made to the district's budget to reflect the funding made available by that Budget Act. The Budget Act was signed by the Governor on June 20, 2014; therefore, the budget revisions must be made available to the public by August 4, 2014.

The final budget approved by the Governor and the State Legislature provided for an additional \$250 million above the funding level proposed in the May Revision for the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), bringing the total LCFF funding up to \$4.75 billion for 2014-15. Another \$400.5 million was provided to fund prior year mandated cost claims. Funding for mandated cost claims will be distributed on a per ADA basis, estimated at \$66/ADA for K-12 districts.

The final adopted budget also made changes to the employer and employee contribution rates to the California State Teachers' Retirement System (CALSTRS). The budget increases employer contribution rates by 0.63% in 2014-15. Employer contribution rates will continue to increase by 1.85% per year through 2019-20 and by .97% in 2020-21, resulting in a contribution rate of 19.1% in 2020-21.

The District's budget was revised to reflect the changes in funding as a result of the State Budget Act. Additional information on LCFF, CALSTRS, apportionment deferrals, and the resulting budget revisions will be presented by Lori Wigg, Assistant Superintendent, Business Services, who will respond to clarifying questions.

**Approval of 45-Day Budget Revision** 

Pursuant to Education Code Section 42127(i)(4), not later than 45 days after the Governor signs the annual Budget Act, a school district is required to make available for public review any revisions in revenues and expenditures made to the district's budget to reflect the funding made available by that Budget Act. The Budget Act was signed by the Governor on June 20, 2014; therefore, the budget revisions must be made available to the public by August 4, 2014.

Three significant budget revisions were made as a result of the State Budget Act. The employer contribution rate for CALSTRS was reduced from 9.50% to 8.88%, resulting in a savings in expenditures of \$295,867. Additionally, revenues were increased by \$1,211,618 to reflect 1) funding for prior year mandated cost claims of \$763,125 and 2) an increase in Gap funding of \$448,493 for the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF).

### **ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION**

WHEREAS, Contractor represents that he or she is specially trained, experienced, and competent to provide the special services and to give the advice called for by this Agreement; and WHEREAS, District has determined that it has a need to enter into this Agreement with Contractor for the special services and advice described NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by the parties hereto as follows: EMPLOYMENT OF CONTRACTOR.
