San Diego State University Partnership Overview - Tina Sardina with SDSU Faculty

- Northmont is a demonstration site for inclusion and team teaching and host to SDSU student teachers
- Kempton Literacy Academy is a demonstration site for SDSU student teachers seeking bilingual certification (BCLAD)
- SDSU student teachers are at sites throughout LMSV
- SDSU Faculty shared about their Teaching and Learning Cohort that is designed to promote collaboration between Special Education and General Education teaching candidates and the Guide Teaching Teams they are paired with.
- SDSU's Innovative Partnership with LMSV is supported by a 3-year grant from the Gates Foundation. Human Resources is hopeful this will provide us with quality teacher candidates ready to be hired in time for large group of retirees projected in the next few years.

Discussion:

- The SAI Model ideally provides seamless support for ALL students, including special education students, in a general education setting.
- In light of the conversations about biliteracy, when will schools begin teaching computer coding as a language using the biliteracy model? SDSU Faculty indicated computer coding can be taught in any language, but requires buy-in and support from the community in order for it to be sustainable.
- It takes 5+ years to become biliterate and Kempton is currently K-3, how are we building capacity to ensure students are able to fulfill goals of a dual immersion program? It is noted that Kempton is adding 4th grade next year and this question is currently being carefully considered and planned for.
