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## ELD Instruction Interest is Ignited During International Educator Visit

Immediately upon return from Thanksgiving Break, seven educator delegates from Language Centers throughout Russia visited Rancho Elementary School in Spring Valley to observe Integrated English Language Development (ELD) in a



variety of classrooms. Afterward, La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools EL Coordinator, Katie Sedgwick, joined Executive Director of Innovation and Engagement, Meg Jacobsen Ed.D., Principal Elisa Holston-Arteaga, and Breakthrough English Resource Teachers: Tara Bernal, and Emily Scheitlin. The group met for a data presentation, "Igniting ELD" Seminar Professional Learning for teachers' overview, and an outline of the district's "Breakthrough English" program for newcomer students.

This was not the first time La Mesa-Spring Valley Schools has hosted educators from around the world to learn how best to provide English language instruction. Last year, the district hosted an additional seven delegates from Bolivia, Georgia, China, Russia, Tunisia, Turkey, and the United Arab Emirates.
