TRUST Blended Learning

- Shared that TRUST Blended Learning has 3 options for families:
 - Online only program
 - Homeschool/independent study
- Blended options

District COVID Updates

- Employees are required to be vaccinated or test on a weekly basis starting 10/18
- Students in Quarantine are placed on an Independent Study Agreement (ISA) with required minutes by grade level
- State law (AB 130) requires synchronous instruction and daily live interaction on the 15th day of an ISA

Virtual Learning Academy

- LMSVSD has gone further than AB 130 requires in order to ensure students maintain connections, and ensure students with disabilities and English Learners receive necessary services
- Virtual Learning Academy provides a daily required zoom session when the ISA begins and ELD, Speech, SAI and services for students on IEPs
- Additional optional zoom sessions are available for enrichment and office hours
- A sample schedule was provided

Breakthrough English

- Breakthrough English, being held at Rancho Elementary, is designed for students who have entered a US school over the past year and are in the beginning stages of learning English
- 200 students were invited to Breakthrough English during October Break 10/4 10/18
- 93 students are registered in 4 classes
- The focus is on oral language and listening through literature, music and art
- Breakthrough English will also be provided during Spring Break in April with a focus on science

DELAC Roles and Responsibilities – Presented by Cara Lawler

- Discussed the critical role that parents play on the DELAC committee
- Viewed district and school data on English Learners from Dataquest website
 - Covered 6 essential responsibilities of the committee to advise the district on:
 - o Development of Master Plan
