1. District Updates

- a. TK Facilities/Grade Span Implications Deann Ragsdale shared the plan for TK expansion including timeline. The expansion of TK has resulted in several capacity issues at elementary schools. 11 out of 17 schools lack the capacity to serve TK-6th. As a result, the suggestion to the board is for 6th grade to return to middle school in 24-25. The first read of the action was at the May Board meeting. The final action to change grade spans will be at the June 2023 meeting.
- b. Elementary Report Card Input Cara SerbanLawler shared the revision of the elementary report card. New grading standards for K-5 will show Met, partially met, and beginning progress towards trimester goals. The Habits of Success mark will be frequently, sometimes, and rarely demonstrated. ELD will now be a part of the regular report card rather than a separate document.

2. Compliance and Program Updates

a. Consolidated Application



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Beth Rackliffe shared how the Consolidated Application is used to determine district funding. She shared the different Title funding available and what each of the categories is used for. She shared the allocations based on the funding formulas that the district would be applying for Title I, II, III, and IV.

b. District Parent and Family Engagement Policy Beth Rackliffe shared the current District and Parent Engagement Policy. Discussion was held about the purpose of the document and which sites create their own engagement policy and compact. Parents were allowed to provide feedback and suggestions for the Engagement Policy. DPAC determined the document was ready to go to the board for final approval.
